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PRAYING

According to the will of God

Man's highest aim should be to bring glory to God (1 Corinthians 10:31), and this includes praying according to His will. First, we must ask for wisdom. "If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him" (James 1:5). In asking for wisdom, we must also trust that God is gracious and willing to answer our prayers: "But when he asks, he must believe and not doubt" (James 1:6; see also Mark 11:24). So, praying according to the will of God includes asking for wisdom (to know the will of God) and asking in faith (to trust the will of God).

Here are seven biblical instructions that will guide the believer in praying according to God's will:

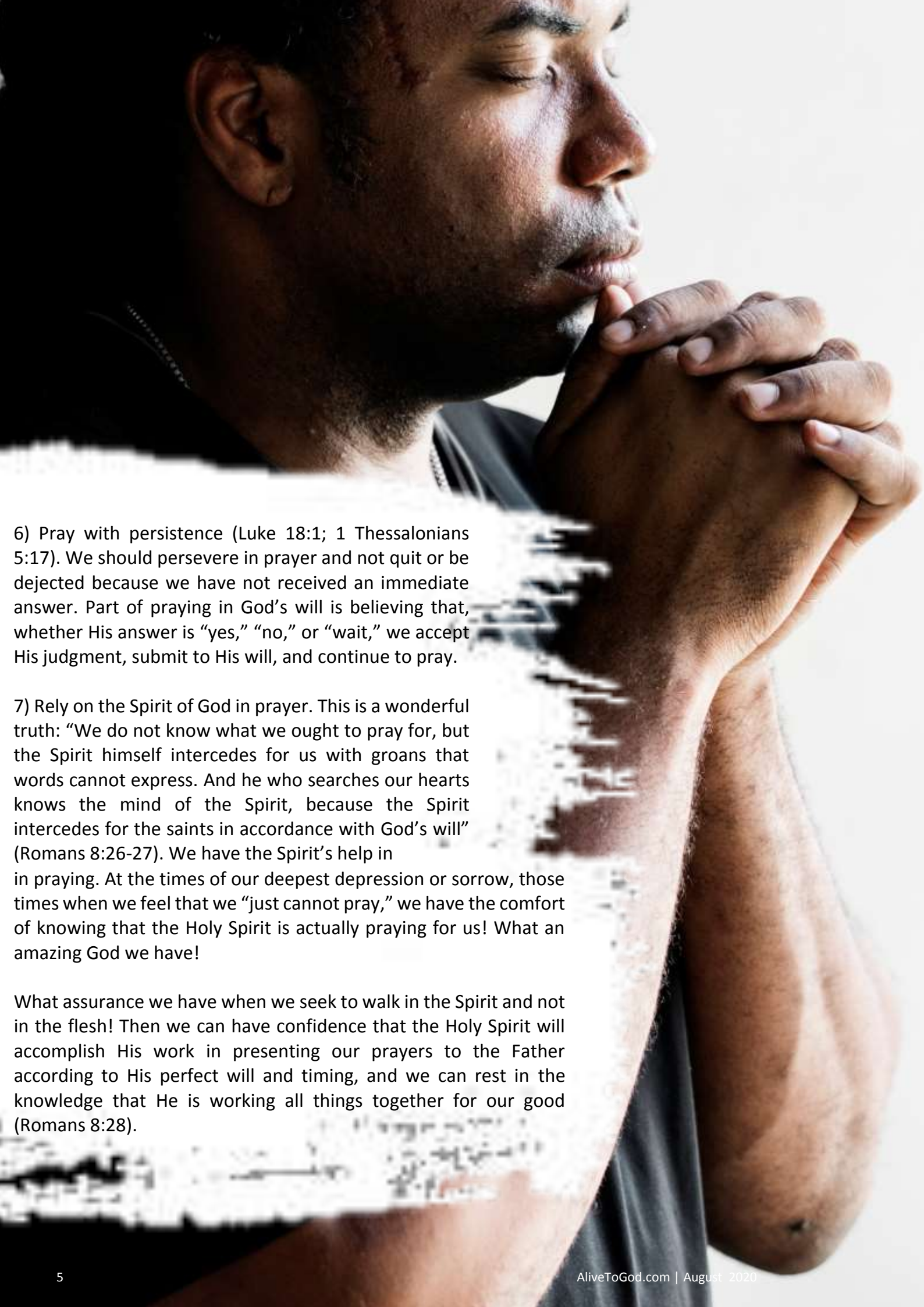
1) Pray for the things for which the Bible commands prayer. We are told to pray for our enemies (Matthew 5:44); for God to send missionaries (Luke 10:2); that we do not enter temptation (Matthew 26:41); for ministers of the Word (Colossians 4:3; 2 Thessalonians 3:1); for government authorities (1 Timothy 2:1-3); for relief from affliction (James 5:13); and for the healing of fellow believers (James 5:16). Where God commands prayer, we can pray with confidence that we are praying according to His will.

2) Follow the example of godly characters in Scripture. Paul prayed for the salvation of Israel (Romans 10:1). David prayed for mercy and forgiveness when he sinned (Psalm 51:1-2). The early church prayed for boldness to witness (Acts 4:29). These prayers were according to the will of God, and similar prayers today can be as well. As with Paul and the early church, we should always be praying for the salvation of others. For ourselves, we should pray as David prayed, always aware of our sin and bringing it before God before it hinders our relationship with Him and thwarts our prayers.

3) Pray with the right motivation. Selfish motives will not be blessed by God. "When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, that you may spend what you get on your pleasures" (James 4:3). We should also pray, not so our lofty words can be heard and we may be seen by others as "spiritual," but mostly in private and in secret, so that our heavenly Father will hear in private and reward us openly (Matthew 6:5-6).

4) Pray with a spirit of forgiveness toward others (Mark 11:25). A spirit of bitterness, anger, revenge or hatred toward others will prevent our hearts from praying in total submission to God. Just as we are told not to give offerings to God while there is conflict between ourselves and another Christian (Matthew 5:23-24), in the same way God does not want the offering of our prayers until we have reconciled with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

5) Pray with thanksgiving (Colossians 4:2; Philippians 4:6-7). We can always find something to be thankful for, no matter how burdened we are by our wants or needs. The greatest sufferer that lives in this world of redeeming love, and who has the offer of heaven before him, has reason to be grateful to God.



6) Pray with persistence (Luke 18:1; 1 Thessalonians 5:17). We should persevere in prayer and not quit or be dejected because we have not received an immediate answer. Part of praying in God's will is believing that, whether His answer is "yes," "no," or "wait," we accept His judgment, submit to His will, and continue to pray.

7) Rely on the Spirit of God in prayer. This is a wonderful truth: "We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express. And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints in accordance with God's will" (Romans 8:26-27). We have the Spirit's help in praying. At the times of our deepest depression or sorrow, those times when we feel that we "just cannot pray," we have the comfort of knowing that the Holy Spirit is actually praying for us! What an amazing God we have!

What assurance we have when we seek to walk in the Spirit and not in the flesh! Then we can have confidence that the Holy Spirit will accomplish His work in presenting our prayers to the Father according to His perfect will and timing, and we can rest in the knowledge that He is working all things together for our good (Romans 8:28).

LIFE AND TROUBLE

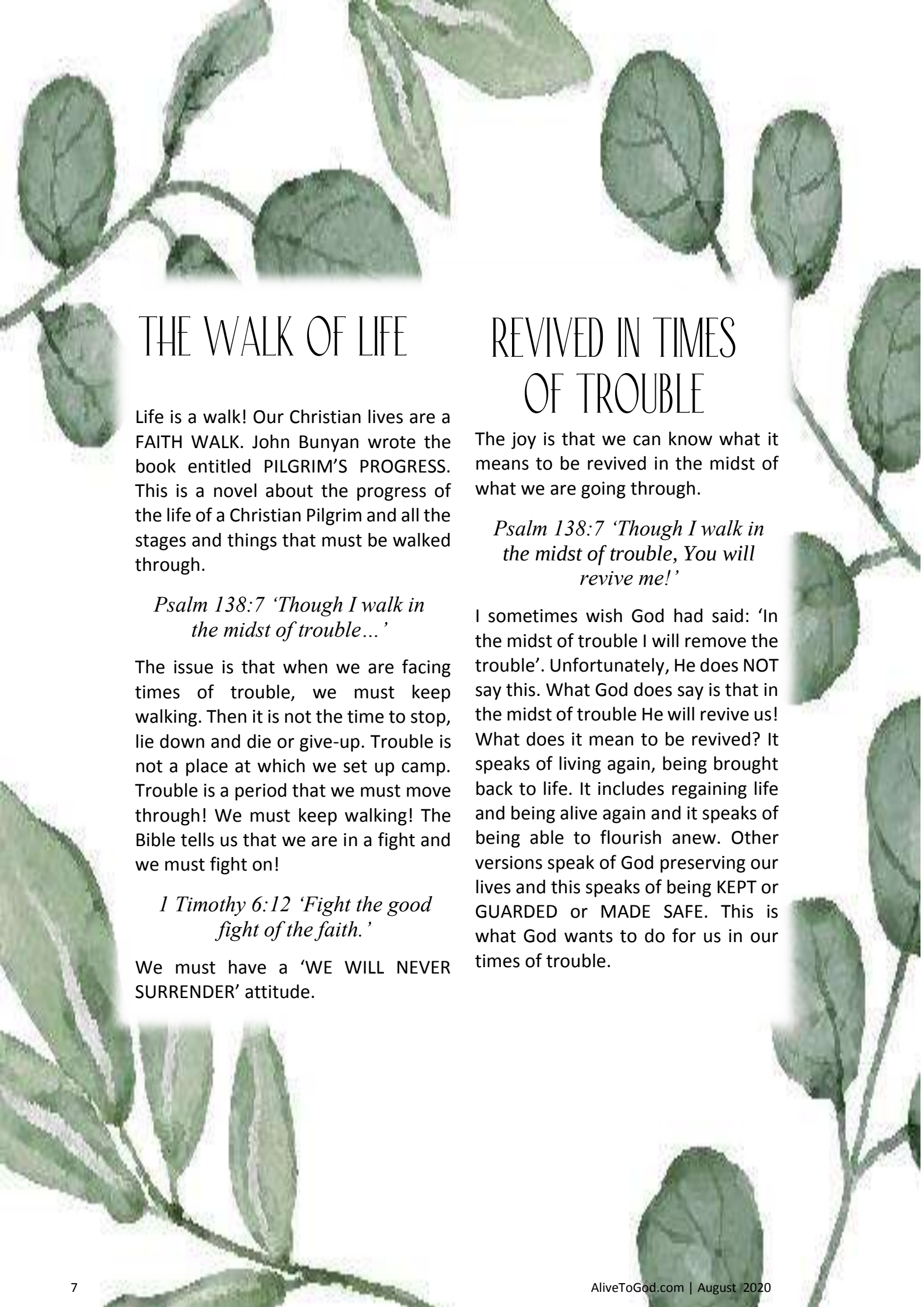

Psalm 138:7 'Though I walk in the midst of trouble...'

The issue is that when we are facing times of trouble, we must keep walking. Then it is not the time to stop, lie down and die or give-up. Trouble is not a place at which we set up camp. Trouble is a period that we must move through! We must keep walking! The Bible tells us that we are in a fight and we must fight on!

1 Timothy 6:12 'Fight the good fight of the faith.'

We must have a 'WE WILL NEVER SURRENDER' attitude.

REVIVED IN TIMES OF TROUBLE

The joy is that we can know what it means to be revived in the midst of what we are going through.

Psalm 138:7 'Though I walk in the midst of trouble, You will revive me!'

I sometimes wish God had said: 'In the midst of trouble I will remove the trouble'. Unfortunately, He does NOT say this. What God does say is that in the midst of trouble He will revive us! What does it mean to be revived? It speaks of living again, being brought back to life. It includes regaining life and being alive again and it speaks of being able to flourish anew. Other versions speak of God preserving our lives and this speaks of being KEPT or GUARDED or MADE SAFE. This is what God wants to do for us in our times of trouble.



GOD WANTS TO WORK ON OUR BEHALF

This is such an encouragement!

Psalm 138:7 'You will stretch forth Your hand'

God wants to stretch forth His hand on your behalf. God wants to work in and through your situation. When God's hand is involved in any way in our lives, something changes. It could be that He will deal with the situation or that He will deliver you. It could be that He will make a way where there seems to be no way. God's hand could even restrain things that were destined to destroy you! The issue is that God wants to work on your behalf. It is as we entrust our lives to Him that He can begin to do this for us. Either God works and we rest, or we work and God rests – the decision is ours.

PRINCIPALITIES & POWER VERSUS FLESH & BLOOD

We have to constantly remind ourselves of what we are fighting against. We often direct our defence against other individuals. The question is how does God see it?

Ephesians 6:12 'For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.'

When we grasp this aspect, it can bring us great freedom and release.

Psalm 138:7 'Though I walk in the midst of trouble, You will revive me; You will stretch forth Your hand against the wrath of my enemies.'

Please note that it says that God will stretch out His hand against the wrath of the enemies and not against the enemies themselves. Your fight is not against flesh and blood! Remember this.



GOD WANTS TO SAVE US!

God wants to step into our lives and save us from those things that would seek to destroy us. God does not want to see us destroyed.

Psalm 138:7 'Though I walk in the midst of trouble, You will revive me; You will stretch forth Your hand against the wrath of my enemies, and Your right hand will save me.'

Psalm 23:4 'Even when walking through the dark valley of death I will not be afraid, for You are close beside me, guarding, guiding all the way.'

This is God's plan and purpose. Claim this as a promise for your life – take hold of it!



LET GO & LET GOD!

God is at work in each of our lives. He is using the things we are facing or going through to work on various aspects of our lives. Firstly, let me remind you that God has not forgotten you. No matter how you may be feeling – God is there for you!

Psalm 138:6 'Though the Lord is on high, yet He regards the lowly.'

He knows what you are facing, and He is aware of what you are going through, even those things deep within your heart. God wants to bring those things that He is working on in our lives to a point of completion and perfection. God does not want you to battle with the same thing on and on.

Psalm 138:8 'The Lord will work out His plans for my life!' (LBT)

What if...? Two little words that can keep your mind going around and around in circles with no end in sight. I don't know about you, but these two words have kept me quite busy at times.

Covid-19 has influenced our lives greatly and currently almost every conversation touches on the subject. For some it has been very stressful and their lives have been greatly disrupted. Many people have lost loved ones and have to go through the grieving process on their own. The trauma of not being able to be beside someone's hospital bed and to comfort them, is traumatic in itself. Other people have also lost their jobs and their income which has brought about huge strain and even fear into their lives. Older people in retirement homes have been unable to see their families and are lonely. RAVENS

When we bought our home just over thirty years ago, there wasn't a single tree on the property.

As a conservationist, this was unacceptable to me, so I proceeded to plant approximately forty trees and large shrubs. I have had to remove some over the years as their roots started to cause problems and a couple trees also died for some or other reason.

Nevertheless, these trees have all grown to be lovely specimens in the garden and they give us great pleasure as we see how many birds they have attracted. This is especially true of the Wild Olive trees, of which there are eight.

At the beginning of this year, something occurred that we have never experienced before. The Wild Olive trees started to bloom like they have never bloomed before. The trees normally have a blueish grey foliage, but suddenly their appearance was transformed by thousands and thousands of tiny white flowers.

With the flowers came the pollen, and with the pollen came the bees. While all the bees were an absolute blessing to see, the pollen became somewhat of a problem. The pollen was bright yellow, and before long, everything below the trees turned yellow as well.

The pollen kept on falling for a few weeks, so you can imagine what it must have looked like.

It was only after a good shower of rain, that the area under the trees returned to normal.

It then occurred to me that we were going to experience a bumper crop of Wild Olive fruit later in the year. March arrived and the clusters of tiny fruit started to develop. They continued to develop until the branches started bending under their weight. I thought that I would have to cut some of the smaller branches off to reduce the load, but amazingly they did not break.

Towards the middle of the month, the fruit started to ripen. This is when all the fun started to happen. Birds, birds and more birds started to arrive to literally feast on the fruit. It seemed as though every fruit eating bird in Centurion got the memo. By the middle of April, we had ten different species of birds frequenting the trees on a daily basis. At times there were up to fifteen Olive Thrushes in one tree eating fruit, as though there was no tomorrow. The same could be said of the Bulbuls.



If you stood under a tree, you would be bombarded by fruit falling as well as other things if you were not careful.

This all coincided with the so called 'lockdown' period which we are now so very familiar with.

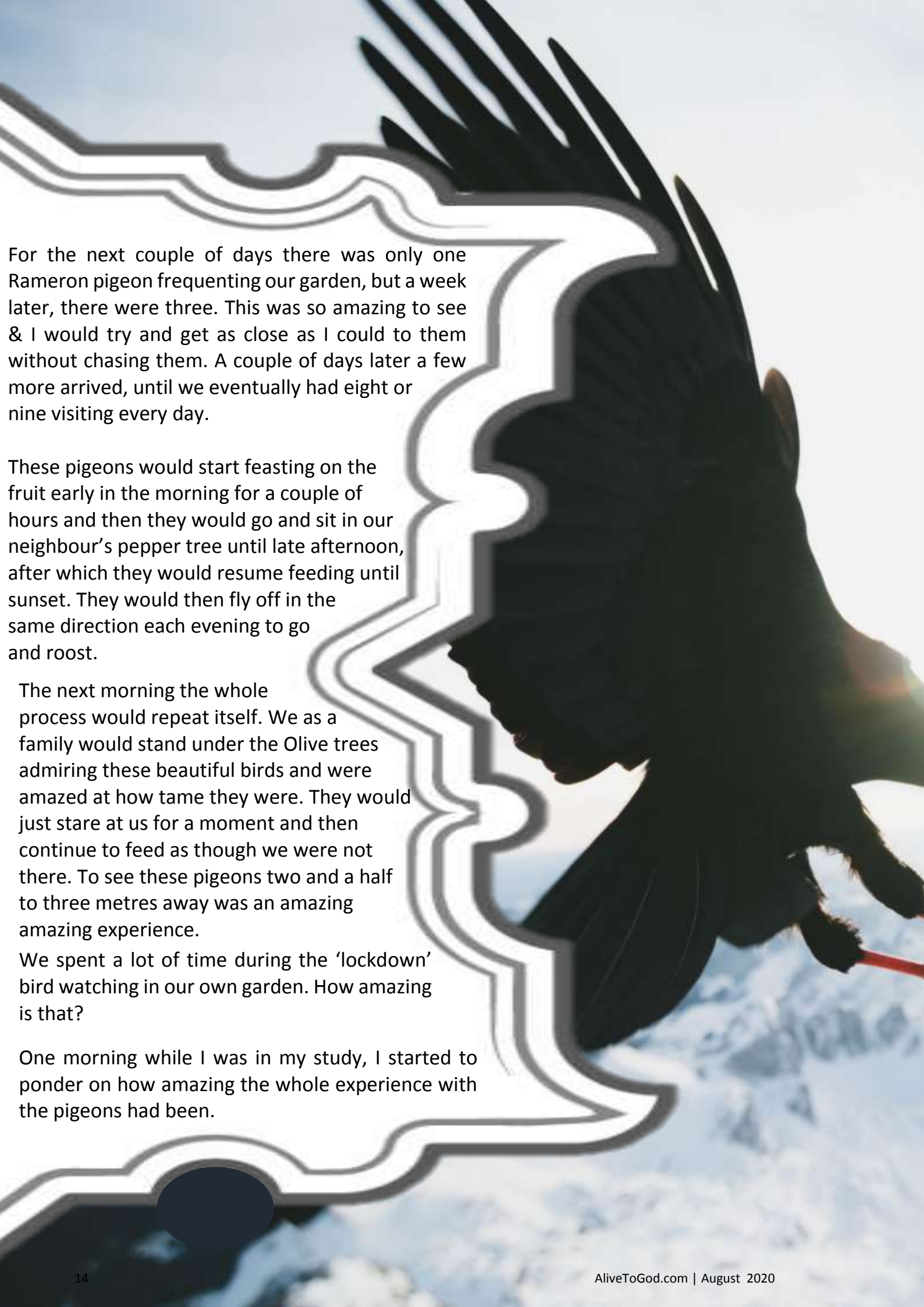
I have recorded every species of bird that we have seen on our property over the last thirty years and I wondered if this abundance of fruit would perhaps attract a new species to our garden. I had a sneaky feeling that a possible candidate would be the Rameron pigeon.

We don't get Rameron pigeons where we stay, but I had seen a colony a couple of kilometres away on more than one occasion. Rameron pigeons are the largest of the pigeons that occur in South Africa, and they really look impressive

Then one Sunday afternoon early in April, while I was looking out of my study window, a pigeon landed on the telephone wire in front of our house.

Due to its sheer size, I just new that this was a Rameron pigeon. I was absolutely ecstatic to eventually see this bird in our garden for the first time.

I knew that if one pigeon had found the fruit, then it would just be a matter of time before the rest of the colony would arrive.



For the next couple of days there was only one Rameron pigeon frequenting our garden, but a week later, there were three. This was so amazing to see & I would try and get as close as I could to them without chasing them. A couple of days later a few more arrived, until we eventually had eight or nine visiting every day.

These pigeons would start feasting on the fruit early in the morning for a couple of hours and then they would go and sit in our neighbour's pepper tree until late afternoon, after which they would resume feeding until sunset. They would then fly off in the same direction each evening to go and roost.

The next morning the whole process would repeat itself. We as a family would stand under the Olive trees admiring these beautiful birds and were amazed at how tame they were. They would just stare at us for a moment and then continue to feed as though we were not there. To see these pigeons two and a half to three metres away was an amazing experience.

We spent a lot of time during the 'lockdown' bird watching in our own garden. How amazing is that?

One morning while I was in my study, I started to ponder on how amazing the whole experience with the pigeons had been.

I then realised how special this had been for us as a family during the 'lockdown' as it had given us so much pleasure and had actually helped us focus on something beautiful instead of the hellish virus.

Almost immediately the Lord spoke to me. It was not an audible voice, but the words were there. He said the following to me: "I sent them." What are You saying, I asked? Again, He said: "I sent them for your pleasure. Just like I sent the Ravens to feed Elijah, I sent the pigeons for your pleasure during this time."

And it shall be, that thou shalt drink of the brook; and I have commanded the Ravens to feed thee there. 1 Kings 17 v 4.

I was absolutely blown away, and I started to praise the Lord and thank Him for His goodness towards us. Why had I not realised this earlier? I started praising Him in tongues as I walked down the passage just thanking Him for revealing this to me.

I was still praying in tongues as I opened the curtain in the bedroom, and when I looked out the window, I got another surprise. There on the bird feeder was another new bird species for our garden. A Rock Pigeon! We have never had a rock pigeon in our garden before,

as they prefer double storey houses and higher buildings. This Rock Pigeon looked so out of place on the bird feeder and none of the other birds wanted to get close to it.

The Lord then spoke to me again and said the following: "And I sent this pigeon as well, as a confirmation to you!"

The Rock Pigeon was there for about twenty minutes and then flew off, and has never been back again.

I have no doubt in my mind that I heard from the Lord and that He did what He said He did. He knew about the virus and the 'lockdown' long before it appeared and gave instruction to the Olive trees to produce fruit that would attract the birds for our great pleasure.

I have a new understanding of just how much God really cares about His children. This has been such an eye opener for me. He even made provision for us as a family to be entertained by birds so as to be able to keep our focus off all the ugliness of the virus. This might sound strange to you, but it happened.

Picture this for a moment. What God was actually trying to show us was the following. Yes, I know that there is a virus infecting a lot of people all over the world and the World Health Organisation has labelled it a pandemic, but don't worry about it. I want you to shift your focus onto Me. Let me share with you something of My creation which will bring you much joy and pleasure during this time, and guess what, it won't cost you a cent. You don't even have to go anywhere to see it, because I will send it to you on a daily basis.

If He cares this much for us, then how can we fear? How can we honestly be afraid? So often we think we know who God is and how much He loves us, but do we?

I'm still trying to fully understand what we experienced. I saw another side of the Father that I haven't really seen before. He knew exactly what we needed and when we needed it. Months ago, He already set His plan in motion. Even though we saw the pollen, the flowers and all the bees, we had no idea what was yet to unfold. He knows what we need long before we ask Him.



He holds your future in His hands. Wow, what a God! Even though we do not know what lies ahead, we can rest assured that He does, and that He only wants the best for His children. You see, after this whole experience, I have come to realise that if He took such an interest in us just to bring us pleasure through birds, then I have fallen so short in my understanding of how great, how good and how absolutely awesome our heavenly Father is.

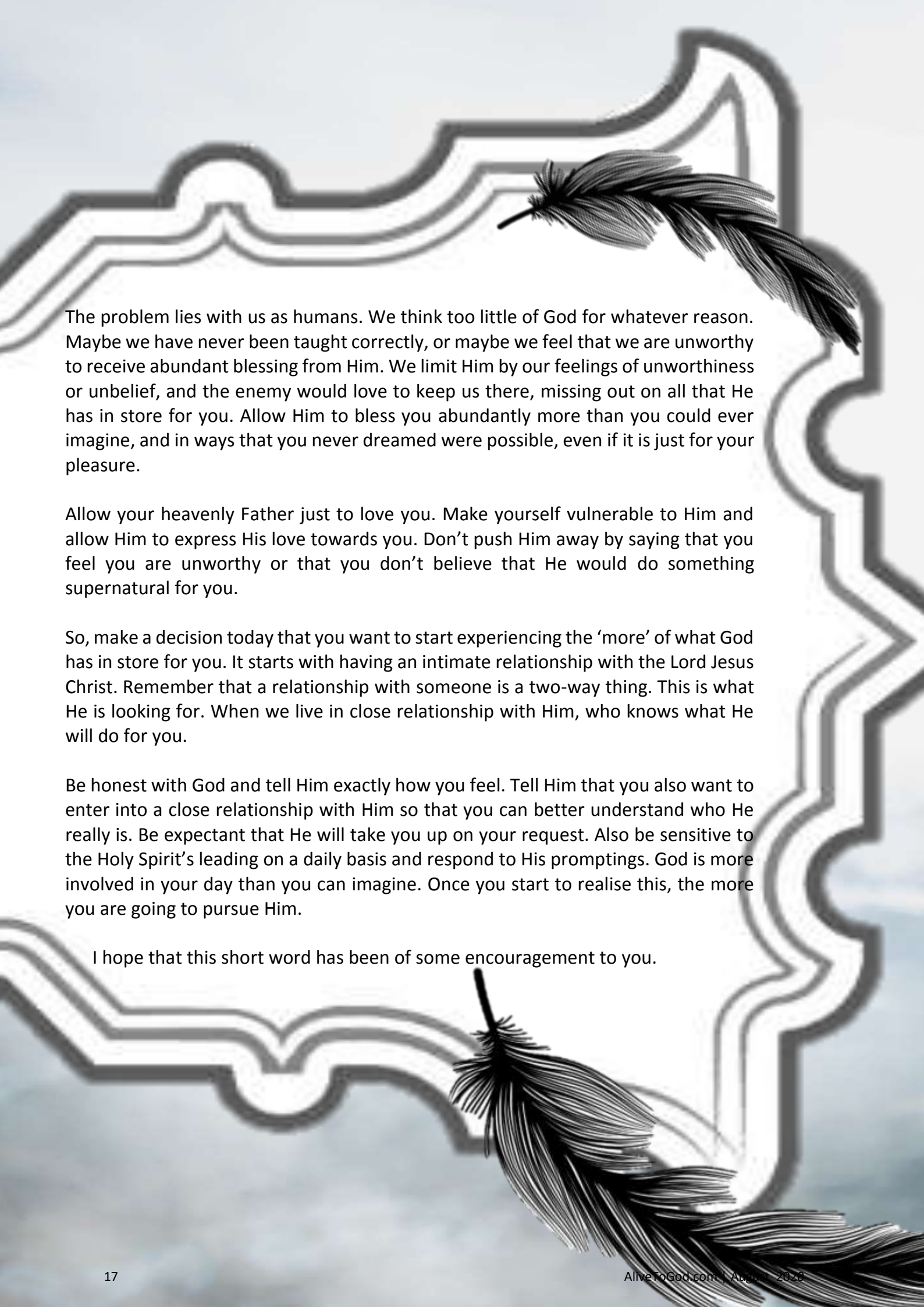
How could I ever doubt You Father?

Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labour of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stalls: Yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation. The Lord God is my strength, and He will make my feet like hinds' feet, and He will make me to walk upon mine high places. Habakkuk 3 v 17 - 19

Towards the end of May, the fruit became less and less and so did the birds and our beautiful pigeons. Suddenly there were only two pigeons left and eventually only one. Now they are all gone. But guess what? This decline in fruit and birds coincided with the week that I was able to start work again. Coincidence? I think not.

It makes me think of the Israelites when they were in the wilderness, and how God supplied manna from heaven until they crossed over the Jordan River into the promised land. Only then did the manna stop.

God is the same yesterday, today and forevermore. He does not change like shifting shadows. Aren't you glad about that?

The problem lies with us as humans. We think too little of God for whatever reason. How can I know when God Is telling me to do something?

Pray, especially when you're unsure of God's will for your life. "If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him" (James 1:5). "Be still before the Lord and wait patiently for Him" (Psalm 37:7). If you don't know what to pray, you can always personalize & pray verses such as, "Show me the way I should go, for to You I lift up my soul" (Psalm 143:8) and, "Guide me in Your truth and teach me" (Psalm 25:5).



The primary way God commands us is through His Word. "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16). If Scripture commands something of us, there's no need to hesitate & wonder if it's really God's will for us. He cares so much about us that He already gave a plain and clear guidebook to life – the Bible. "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path" (Psalm 119:105). "The Law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul."



The statutes of the Lord are trustworthy, making wise the simple" (Psalm 19:7). "How can a young man keep his way pure? By living according to Your Word" (Psalm 119:9). Likewise, God never, ever contradicts Himself, so He'll never ask you to something contradictory to Scripture. He will never ask you to sin. He will never ask you to do something Jesus Christ wouldn't do. We need to immerse ourselves in the Bible, so we will know which actions meet God's standards. "Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth: meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything that is written in it" (Joshua 1:8).

Christians also have the Holy Spirit to discern what is, or is not, God's will for our lives. "The Spirit of truth . . . will guide you into all truth" (John 16:13). Sometimes the Holy Spirit will either agitate our conscience if we're making a wrong decision, or He will pacify and encourage us when we're leaning toward the right decision. Even if He doesn't intervene in such noticeable ways, we can have confidence that He's always in charge. Sometimes God can alter a situation without us even realizing He has acted. "The Lord will guide you always" (Isaiah 58:11).

If God is calling you to take a leap of faith, be encouraged by His presence. "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified, do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go" (Joshua 1:9).

And remember, "Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7). "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding, in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will direct your paths" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

What we are not to do is expect to hear voices from God. There is a dangerous trend today where people seek to hear a "word from the Lord," extraneous to the words He has already given us in the Bible. "The Lord told me . . ." has become the mantra of experience-driven Christianity. Unfortunately, what He "tells" one person often contradicts what He "tells" another, and these extra-biblical revelations have proven to be very divisive, tearing apart church after church as one person's experience seeks to take precedence over another's. This results in chaos, benefiting no one except Satan, who loves to sow discord among believers. We should make the Apostle Peter our example in these matters. In spite of the miraculous experience on the Mount of Transfiguration, where he beheld the glorified Christ speaking with Moses and Elijah who came from heaven, Peter refused to rely on that experience, declaring instead that "We also have the more sure prophetic word which you do well to heed as a light that shines in a dark place" (2 Peter 1:18-19 NKJV).



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
